



Blooming Tea Party Party Flow

In addition to the Party Flow you follow for your party, incorporate the steps below to create a Blooming Party Experience

Party Planning

- Talk with your Host to determine the theme of the party:

Relaxation	Calming Experience	Peaceful Mindset	"Me time"
Break from work	Break from the kids	Time with friends	Other?

- Set the Atmosphere: Where in the Host's house would be best to create the atmosphere she wants for her party?

Living Room	Patio / Porch	Around the Pool	Terrace or Deck
Sun Room	Dining Room	Entertainment Room	Other?

- Other elements to consider when setting the atmosphere:

- Determine recipe if you're not making the scones (See **Recipe Cards** on CD in your Tea Sampler Pack)

Setting the Stage:

- Remind Host of the atmosphere or tone she wants to create for her guests.
 - Tea Party intended to set a calming, relaxing, soothing atmosphere and tone. Throughout the party, this tone should be integrated into everything you say and do.
- Set out extra tea cups – the Sampler Pack has 4. An average party has 4 to 6 guests – so be prepared.

Greet Guests:

- Same as your Party

Mini-Demonstration of Products and Engage Guests (Part 1)

- Introduce yourself.
- Ask the guests to join you in the kitchen to make an indulgence to compliment the tea experience.
- Demonstrate TW products and share Features and Benefits as you make the scones or one of the other recipes chosen by the Host.
- Suggested TW products for the preparation of the recipe are located on the recipe card.
- Scones - 20 minutes to bake.

Mini-Demonstration of Products and Engage Guests (Part 2)

- Invite the guests to join the Host in the *living room* (the room the Host has determined to set the atmosphere)
- Use the **Tea Party Flash Cards** to engage guests and learn more about their needs (e.g., if they need more "me time," less stress, more relaxation, pampering, etc.)
- Begin demonstrating the Blooming Tea and serve scones or recipe made earlier.
- Use Tea Party Flash Cards to engage guests in relative factoids, product information and health benefits of the tea.
