

# Kid Concoctions

## Play TupperDough

Another mix-it-yourself recipe for clay that is fun all year through. This makes a great gift along with the *great new kid's party set!*

4 cups flour  
1 cup salt  
1 heaping tsp. alum  
2 Tbls. shortening, melted  
2 cups warm water

Mix and kneed thoroughly in the Thatsa Bowl Jr.. (You can add food coloring or leave plain.) Store in sealed One Touch Bowls. If refrigerated it will last indefinitely.  
\*Note: if you use margarine, instead of vegetable oil, the dough will harden when left exposed to air. Some children like this!

## Dry Finger Paint

1/2 cup Niagara Powdered Starch  
1/2 cup Ivory Snow  
1/4 cup powdered paint (hobby/craft store)

Mix all ingredients together. Wet butcher or shelf paper. Put paint in Spice Shakers to shake out paint.

## Applesauce Cinnamon Dough

1/2 cup cinnamon  
1/2 cup applesauce

Place cinnamon and applesauce in Thatsa Bowl Jr. Seal and let the kids shake! Make shapes. Allow your dough to air-dry for 12 hours or until hard.

## Pudding Paint

1 Large package of instant vanilla puddling (3.4 oz)  
2 cups ice-cold water  
Food coloring

Whisk water and pudding together in Thatsa Bowl Jr. for 2 minutes. Refrigerate for 5 minutes. Divide pudding and add 5-7 drops of food coloring as desired. Great as finger paints too!

**WIPES** (for baby care, makeup removal, kitchen, bathroom, etc.)

Cut a roll of Bounty Paper Towels in half with a sharp knife, remove the cardboard cylinder, which will also start the first sheet out from the center, and place the half roll in a Signature Series 3 container.

- 3 c. water
- 1 Tbsp. Johnson & Johnson Baby Shampoo
- 1 Tbsp. Johnson & Johnson Baby Oil

In a large Mix-n-stor, mix above ingredients and pour slowly over the paper towels in the Signature Series 3 container. Let set for 24 hours.

**PLAYDOUGH**

- 1 c. flour
- 1 c. water
- 2 Tbsp. vegetable oil
- 1/2 c. salt
- 2 Tbsp. cream of tartar

Mix and bake at 350 degrees for 5-10 minutes. Divide into 4 balls and color with food coloring. Place into Tupperware Bell Tumblers or Modular Mate Round 1's. Great stocking stuffers and won't dry out.

**BISQUICK MIX**

- 8 1/2 c. all-purpose flour
- 1 Tbsp. baking powder
- 1 Tbsp. salt
- 2 tsp. cream of tartar
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 1/2 c. instant nonfat dry milk
- 2 1/4 c. vegetable shortening

In a large bowl, sift together all dry ingredients. Blend well. With pastry blender, cut in shortening until evenly distributed. Mixture will resemble cornmeal in texture. Label and store in Modular Mate Square 3 or Modular Mate Rectangle 2 container. Use within 10 to 12 weeks. Makes 13 cups of mix.

**variation:** Use 4 1/2 c. all-purpose flour and 4 1/2 c. whole-wheat flour instead of 8 1/2 c. all-purpose flour. Increase baking powder to 2 Tbsp.
